7. IMAGE BACKUP

- a. Power down, then plug-in an external HDD or Network cable that will get you to a hard drive. A second internal Drive is OK for backups
- b. BOOT FROM AN ACRONIS RESCUE CD (or other image backup CD) AND DO A FULL IMAGE BACKUP to a different physical hard-drive, external or internal (Back up ALL Partitions).
- c. After the back-up, UNPLUG the Network cable and/or the External hard-drive BEFORE powering up the PC and booting XP. Remember it could be infected!.

8. HARDWARE INSPECTION:

- a. BATTERY: Power off the PC, unplug it and measure that the "BACKUP" battery voltage is 3.01 volts or more. (Desktops only).
- b. MOBO: Visually inspect the Motherboard for swollen or leaky capacitors. (Desktops only).
- c. FAN CHECK: Power up the PC and make sure all fans are rotating. For LAPTOPS: You can get the fans running by running the Stress Utility called PRIME95.
- d. KEYBOARD FUNCTION KEYS: On laptops, make sure the Fn Function keys operate correctly.
- 9. TIME & DATE: Verify the Time, AM/PM, Date, Year, and Time-Zone are all absolutely correct.

10. SYSTEM RESTORE:

- a. Verify that XP System Restore is running on drive C. WARNING: The PC should only be running ONE restore program, and only on Drive C. Not on any other drives.
- b. SET A RESTORE POINT (Start > All Programs > Accessories > System Tools > System Restore)
- 11. SCHEDULED TASKS: Remove any tasks that you do not understand. (Control Panel > Scheduled Tasks)
- **13. CLEAN TEMP FILES, COOKIES, ETC:** (Run TFC or Ccleaner, but not both)
 - a. TFC Utility: Close all programs & run the Temp File Cleaner utility (This will auto-reboot). _____MB
 - b. CCLEANER SCAN: Verify the latest version of CCleaner is installed. Set-up & configure CCleaner. Run "File Clean":, then <u>for each User</u>, run "file clean" again. DO THIS TASK FOR <u>EACH USER ACCOUNT</u>. FILES cleaned:_____MB
 - c. Delete all files in the "Downloads" folder (for each User Account).
- **14. RUN ANTI-MALWARE SCANS:** If you know this PC is infected, go to my "How to Remove Malware from XP" checklist, then return here. If you have just completed the checklist, skip this step.
 - a. Disable real-time protection in any installed anti-virus programs. (Especially Norton, McAfee, CA, or Trend.), including any third party firewall programs.
 - b. Unplug any external hard-drives or flash drives that are not part of the scans.
 - c. Install the following programs and run full scans:
 - 1) SAS-STANDALONE SCANNER: Download the most up-to-date version from: http://superantispyware.com/onlinescan.html and run it.
 - 2) MBAM: Install MalwareBytes Anti-Malware and run a full-scan. (No updates yet)
 - 3) MBAR: Run the MawareByes Anti Rookit tool.
 - 4) SPYBOT S&D: Install updates, Immunize, and run a scan.
 - 5) KASPERSKY VIRUS REMOVAL TOOL: Download the latest version and run this tool.
 - d. Make sure the Windows Firewall is ON. (Control Panel > Windows Firewall). WARNING: Some AV suites prevent the Windows Firewall from being turned on.
 - e. Connect the PC to a "standalone" Network (with no other PC's connected).
 - f. Run an ESET On-line Scan from: http://www.eset.com/online-scanner
- **15. USER COMPLAINTS:** Try to reproduce and fix any specific problems the user is complaining about.

- 16. BIOS UPDATE: WARNING: Only do this if it is needed to fix an issue. Be aware there always is a risk of permanently damaging the motherboard while doing a BIOS flash.
- 17. REMOVE PROGRAMS. Remove all old versions of Adobe Reader, FLASH FF, FLASH IE, Shockwave, all JAVA's, Ad-Aware, Windows Defender & SpyBot Search & Destroy. With the User's permission, remove any old or unnecessary programs using "Add/Remove" Programs or Revo Uninstaller. Remove "Site Advisor" if it is installed. It conflicts with newer anti-malware programs.

19. NEW DESKTOP FOLDERS:

- a. Create folders:
 - 1) "UTILITY PROGRAMS" folder: On the Desktop, create a new folder called "UTILITY Programs". Note: You can customize this Folder's Icon Image by (Right-clicking Icon > Properties > Customize Tab > Change Icon button. Select an Icon and click <OK>, <OK>). The new Icon Image should now be there.
 - 2) "ANTI-MALWARE PROGRAMS" folder: On the Desktop, create a new folder called "Anti-Malware" Programs. Customize the Icon as desired.
- b. Move all desired Program start Icons into the two new folders. Leave others on the Desktop.

20. FOLDER OPTIONS SET-UP

- a. DEFAULT FOLDER VIEW: This sets the Default view for "All Folders". Open the "My Documents" folder and change the view to your preferred default view for ALL folders. (I prefer the "Details" view). Then (click Tools > Folder Options > View Tab > click the "Apply to All Folders" button [near the top]).
- b. FOLDER VIEW OPTIONS: (Control Panel > Folder Options > View Tab > Advanced).
 - 1) Verify the following boxes are checked as shown:
 - ☑ Display simple folder view in Explorer's Folders List
 - ☑ Display the full path in the title Bar.
 - -- Hidden files and folders
 - Show Hidden files and Folders
 - ☐ Hide extensions for known file types. *Un-check this one!*
 - ☑ Hide protected operating system files
 - ☑ Remember each Folder's view settings.

 - 2) Click the <Apply> Button at the bottom.

- 21. NETWORK CONNECTIONS FOR WIRED LAN PC's (Control Panel > Network Connections)
 - a. LAN Properties: Right-click on "Local Area Connection", click properties, then select:
 - 1) ☑ Show icon in notification area when connected.
 - 2) Motify me when this connection has limited or no connectivity.
 - 3) Click OK, OK, Close to exit.

23. WINDOWS UPDATE:

- a. AUTOMATIC UPDATES: Make sure Automatic Updates is still OFF. (Control Panel > Automatic Updates).
- b. Verify Service Pack 3 is installed: (Control Panel > System > General tab). If not, you should install SP3 before any other updates. Install from CD if possible (See my SP3 INSTALL GUIDE).
- c. Run Windows Update manually (Start > All Programs > Windows Update or Microsoft Update).
 - 1) Select [Custom]. If "High priority" updates are found, install them. If IE8 is not yet installed, UN-CHECK it and hide it. If IE7 is not yet installed, install all "High priority" updates until IE7 if offered, then install IE7 as a "High priority" update.
 - 2) Keep <u>re-running</u> Windows Update, always selecting [Custom] until no more "High priority" updates are found.
 - 3) Run Windows Update [Custom] again and install any <u>desired</u> "Software, Optional" updates including WMP 11. (Do NOT install "Windows Search 4.0" or "Windows Live Essentials").
 - 4) WMP: If you have just installed WMP 11, open it and "first time use" configure it. During the config, be sure to UN-CHECK the box = "□ Download Usage rights automatically...." If WMP was already installed, click (*Tools* > *Options* > "Privacy" tab), and make sure box for "□ Download usage rights automatically..." is UN-checked. If Windows Media Player is not at version 11, click Help and "Check for player updates".
 - 5) Install all <u>desired</u> "Hardware, Optional" updates. *(the latest Microsoft approved Drivers)*. USE CAUTION: These can be a LOWER Level than is already installed on the PC. If a lower level, "Hide" them.

24. MICROSOFT UPDATE:

- a. Even if you do not have "Microsoft Office" installed, you should activate "Microsoft Update". Once activated, "Microsoft Update" will keep all Microsoft products secure and up to date (except for Office 2002 or older. Microsoft no longer supports updates for older Office Products. Bummer). You can easily tell if it is active because it changes the "Windows Update Home" screen to say "Microsoft Update Home".
- b. To activate Microsoft Update, start the regular Windows Update. On the Windows Update Home main screen, you will see an announcement on the right side of the screen offering "Microsoft Update". Click on that and let IE install the required ActiveX control.
- c. After you have activated "Microsoft Update", go to Microsoft Update Home screen and run it (Custom) again and again until no new updates appear.
- d. If MSE (Microsoft Security Essentials) is desired, you can now install it as an Optional update.
- **25. DEVICE MANAGER ISSUES:** (Control Panel > System > Hardware Tab > Device Manager button).
 - a. Make sure there are no devices with Exclamation marks, Question marks, or Red X's.
 - If you see any exceptions, delete or un-install the bad entries and reboot to see if XP can re-detect & re-install the devices OK.
 - c. Fix all issues before continuing!

- **26. HARD DRIVE CHECKS:** Go through any uncompleted steps of my "SPEED UP XP" Checklist and: **a. ERROR CHECK** all hard drives. (chkdsk /f /r). See my XP TIPS sheet for details on running chkdsk. Check the log for details. (Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Event Viewer > Application > Winlogon)
 - **b. SPACEMONGER:** Run Spacemonger 4.0.0 (Portable) to see if any large unusual file blocks show up. Research them an delete as necessary and as permitted by the owner.
 - **c. DEFRAG:** Check to see if a defrag is needed (>5% fragmented). File Frag: ____% Before, ____% After
 - d. SPINRITE SCAN: If time allows, be sure to run a "level 4" SpinRite Scan on all hard drives.

27. SYSTEM PROPERTIES:

- **a. COMPUTER REGISTERED OWNER+:** Verify the Registered Owner and Registered Org are correct. If wrong, search the registry (using Start > run > regedit) using the old data, and correct the info in each instance found. Usually three or so.
- b. COMPUTER NAME + STUFF: (Control Panel > System > Computer Name tab & General tab). Verify the PC has a good Computer Name (i.e. <u>Dell-D8300</u>), a good Computer Description (i.e. <u>Jim's Dell PC</u>), and the desired Workgroup: (i.e. <u>MSHOME</u>). Note: The Workgroup Name on every PC in a home network must be exactly the same to communicate between PC's.
- **c. STARTUP & RECOVERY**: (Control Panel > System > Advanced Tab, under Startup and Recovery, click the "Settings" button). Under "System Failure", <u>un-check</u> both "□ Send an Administrative Alert" and "□ Automatically Restart".
- **d. ERROR REPORTING**: (*Control Panel > System > Advanced Tab*). Below Startup and Recovery, click the "Error Reporting" button. Select "⊙ Disable error reporting", but leave "☑ But notify me when critical errors occur".
- e. VIRTUAL MEMORY: Verify the Virtual Memory is set to "System managed size". (Control Panel > System > Advanced Tab > "Performance", <Settings> button > Advanced tab > Virtual Memory, "Change" button). Select "⊙ System managed size", then click the "Set" button. (Warning: You MUST click the <Set> button for the change to take effect). If the PC has a second hard drive (Drive D:), put the paging file on that drive for improved PC speed.
- **f. VISUAL EFFECTS**: (Control Panel > System Icon > Advanced Tab, Performance, click < Settings>). To improve speed, on the Visual Effects Tab, UN-CHECK ALL BOXES EXCEPT:
 - ✓ "☑ Smooth edges of screen fonts" "☑ Use Common Tasks in Folders"
 - ✓ "☑ Use Drop Shadows"
 "☑ Use visual styles on windows and buttons" (optional)
 - ✓ Warning: Every time you make a change here, most of the Desktop Appearance Settings will reset back to default.

28. DISABLE AUTOPLAY/AUTORUN:

Using the TweakUI utility: In "Tweak UI" Left-hand column, open up: (+My Computer > +Autoplay > Types), then uncheck the box that "Enables autoplay for removable devices.

29. MOUSE: (Control Panel > Mouse)

- a. Button's Tab: Drag the "Double-click speed" lever to the SLOWEST setting,
- **b.** Pointers Tab: Scheme: Choose the "MAGNIFIED" system scheme. If desire, customize the Normal Pointer with any special Pointer using the Customize box. <u>UN-CHECK</u> the box for "■ Enable Pointer Shadow".
- c. Pointer Options Tab: Set "pointer speed": medium to fast. Check the boxes:
 ☑ Automatically move pointer to the default button. ☑ Show location of pointer when I press Ctrl key
- **d.** Wheel Tab: Choose a setting of 3 or 4 lines at a time. (Personal preference)
- e. TAP: If on a laptop: TURN OFF TAP!!! (also called "Tap-to-click"). Very annoying feature.

30. DISPLAY/DESKTOP optimizations: (Control Panel > Display).

- a. **SETTINGS Tab:** (Control Panel > Display > Settings tab)
 - 1) DESKTOP: If you are using the owner's monitor, click (the Advanced button > Monitor Tab). Make sure Monitor type and Refresh rate are the best match for the Monitor. Higher is better.
 - LAPTOP: If you are on a laptop, make sure the Screen resolution setting is the best for the owner's vision and needs. See OPTIMIZE MONITOR SETTINGS in my "IMPROVE DISPLAY READABILITY" sheet.
- **b. DESKTOP Tab:** (Control Panel > Display > Desktop Tab > Customize Desktop button).
 - 1) GENERAL Tab: Check the boxes for ☑ My Docs, & ☑ My Computer and UN-CHECK the box for □ Run Cleanup Wizard every 60 days".
 - 2) WEB Tab: Make sure all items are UN-CHECKED!
 - 3) Click OK to exit "Desktop Items".
- c. SCREEN SAVER Tab: (Control Panel > Display > Screen Saver tab).
 - 1) Verify the Screen Saver settings are set the way the User wants.
 - 2) "Power" button: Leave the Power Options set to "Always On" for now. If Hibernation feature is desired, then while still in the "Power Options Properties" window, click the Hibernate Tab and check the box for "☑ Enable Hibernation". Then click the Advanced Tab and choose if you want a password or not after waking up.
- d. APPEARANCE Tab: Adjust these settings using my "IMPROVE DISPLAY READABILITY" tips sheet

31. DESKTOP:

- a. Check the Desktop Folder size (C:\Documents and Settings\<Username>\Desktop). It should be under 500MB
- b. If the Desktop Icons have moved as a result of changes to the Display Properties, restore them to their original positions using the Desktop image saved in an earlier step.
- c. Delete any unneeded Icons from the Desktop or create a folder on the Desktop, call it "Old Icons" and drag the Icons into that folder. That way you don't lose them. WARNING: Removing any ICONS from the Desktop or dragging them into folders can affect other User's Desktops.
- d. Copy any favorite Start Menu ICONS from the Start Menu to the Desktop using "Right-click & drag"

32. START MENU:

- a. Find the "Windows Update" or the "Microsoft Update" start Icon under (Start > All Programs). Right-click,

33. TASKBAR:

- a. Verify the Quick Launch bar is visible. If not, (Right-click the Taskbar > Toolbars, then click (to check) "üQuick Launch").
- b. Add Quick Launch Bar Icons: Drag any desired Icons to the Quick Launch Area. If the Icons won't drag, unlock the Taskbar. If the Icons do not all show up, unlock the Task bar, then drag the separator to the right until the Icons all show up.
- c. Verify the Taskbar is locked. If not, (Right-click the Taskbar, then click (to check) "üLock the Taskbar").
- **34. SYSTEM TRAY:** (Right-click Taskbar > Properties > Customize), and set up desired Icons to "Always Show" in the system tray. Items like; Volume, MSE, Network, Messenger, Synaptics Trackpad, etc....
